

- A roll call is conducted prior to the children leaving the OOSH service grounds.
- The excursion coordinator is to ensure they know the number of children who are in our care.

If the accident is serious: Move those able to walk away from the scene of the accident to a safe location. This will need to be assessed at the time. Assess casualties and administer first aid as best you can until emergency help arrives. Call '000' and cooperate with emergency services at all times. At least one Educator (if possible) to accompany children
to hospital until parents arrive. Contact centre and Manager as soon as possible. – Educator at service will begin contacting parents. • Mechanical Breakdown: Keep children safe by staying on the
